# LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDER



I am so pleased to be able to tell you that our new kennels are now complete, except for a very small snagging list, which doesn't prevent them from being used. Our rescued canines are much cosier, and appear to be somewhat more relaxed, especially as they have purpose built dog flaps enabling them to go in and out as they wish. The three long stay rooms with their own little gardens are a great success, and the dogs in there seem far more content and laid back, enjoying their home comforts, particularly their sofas and arm chair. There are also six large gardens so that they can have recreational time away from their kennels as well as walks in the woods.

So now we just need to make the site more appealing by planting some trees and animal friendly plants. Of course, the new builds make the rest of Holly Hedge look rather drab, but we can live with this until we raise more funds – then it will be the cats' turn for a revamp, incorporating a larger area for feral cats during their stay with us, until they are ready to be re-homed.

It would be nice if all the animals we took in were easy to re-home, but this will never be the case, and we totally accept this as the norm. We are not a charity who picks and chooses the best looking, or the best behaved, or those without problems, be it health-wise or behavioral. We are a charity that exists to help those who need us – flaws and all!

Most of our rescues are usually re-homed quite quickly, but from time to time there are those unlucky ones who can spend many months, or even a couple of years with us until that special someone comes along who can see beyond the dog who is barking frantically in the kennel. Likewise the cat who hisses at the sight of an unfamiliar face or recoils at the sound of a voice it doesn't know. Many animals behave differently in a kennel or cattery environment purely because they are in strange surroundings and all the busy comings and goings are completely alien to what was once their way of life. They don't understand that Holly Hedge is a half-way house, and that there is hope of a forever home on the horizon. Because some are bewildered and scared, they can behave out of character which can put many prospective owners from choosing them.

Holly Hedge has come a long way since it first opened its gates in March 1992. It has been a roller coaster of ups and downs, and trial and error, with mistakes made along the way – but we are still here, and always will be as long we are needed. We have a lot to be thankful for, and a lot to be proud of too.

Huge thanks to our supporters, volunteers and all our dedicated staff, you all do a brilliant job for our rescues, and we appreciate each and every one of you – and so do our four legged friends. We certainly couldn't do such a good job without your help. Thank you so much.


#### **Putting the Fun in Fundraising:**




#### Prince

Loved and not alone.


# A PLEA FROM OUR SEMI FERALS

There is a big difference in what is deemed to be a 'feral' cat, and a cat that has become 'feral'!

Those born in the wild with no human contact, are considered truly feral if they aren't handled before they are 12 weeks old. It is purported that there

is no hope of finding them a domestic home as they are so-say beyond help, and it is in their best interest to neuter, and return them to where they came from as long as there is food and shelter available. We have never yet had to do this as patient, domestic homes have been found.

Our grateful thanks must go to our staff and our volunteer cat cuddlers and lock up ladies who spend their time sitting in with these deserving rescues, helping them to trust and adapt to thinking that the human race isn't so bad after all. These lovely ladies have done so much to help us rehabilitate and rehome these deserving felines.



Often the poor mother has been a family pet, dumped just because she is pregnant, and her irresponsible owners, who should have had her spayed in the first place, don't want kittens running around! In time she too becomes frightened of humans, and who could blame her! The poor mum is now fearful, doing her best to survive and care for her babies.

Some of these abandoned souls are saved by caring people who alert a rescue to their plight, others are not so fortunate and go on to produce more kittens, which then become mothers or sires themselves – so then there becomes a colony of unneutered mums, dads and kittens.

So what happens to these poor victims of a throwaway society? Well, with much in-breeding, leading to genetic disorders, malnutrition, sickness, parasites, as well as predators, human and otherwise, then the colony can be wiped out, and in the process suffer immeasurably. It is true that cats can survive in the wild - that is until they become ill and cannot fend for themselves or hunt for food. So the question arises - when these defenseless, maligned creatures are trapped, hopefully saved and come into rescue, what is to be done with them? Sometimes there is a case for euthanasia, when FeLV or other incurable diseases are diagnosed and the cat is suffering and will continue to do so and is petrified of being handled - after all it is not life at all costs, but quality of life for the future.

Then there is the frightened little kitten with eyes like saucers, not knowing what is in store - the mother who is hissing and spitting and lashing out, defending her babies because she doesn't know what fate befalls them - the unneutered tom cat that has to have a blood test as he has been defending his territory - the kittens whose mother has been killed on the road, and have never been touched by human hand and think of us as the enemy! Our hearts go out to them.

What do we do with them? Well firstly we do everything we can to help them, get them veterinary treatment, and assess the situation over a period of time. Some we have had neutered, treated for parasites and rehomed to outdoor homes such as stables, but mostly these dear, frightened, mistrusting, hissing and spitting balls of fire, have been rehomed where they have been transformed into purring, happy to be warm, cosy and comfortable, much loved pets - food in abundance and able to go in and out as they please, as well as having their owners wrapped around all 4 paws.

At Holly Hedge we believe in giving our would-be ferals the chance of living normal lives, their faith in humans restored, as you will see in some of their happy endings.

It really isn't pleasant,

Fending for oneself.

And to have that sinking feeling,

That life's left you on the shelf.

Just like all the others,

We need a special home.

And to reap all the rewards,

Of not being alone.

So can we tempt you with the challenge,

Of a semi-feral cat?

You'll find it so fulfilling,

You can be sure of that.

Our lives so far have not been great,

So please just take it steady.

I am a Border Terrier/Jack Russell lady who was used as a puppy farm mum and extremely badly abused. I was rescued by the RSPCA and then taken to be cared for by Holly Hedge. I don't want to dwell too much on my previous horrible few years of life, but here goes.

I was kicked, attacked by the other larger dogs, my food was taken from me, as fun games by the humans, so the only thing I had to live for, was to care for my puppies. They were taken from me and then I had more puppies, and more puppies.






My humans would like to say a few words.



**DAY 2:** Arusha. Upon arrival we transfer to Arusha town for a trip briefing and chance to relax before the challenge begins.

**DAY 3:** Start of the trek to Machame Camp. Our challenge starts at Machame Gate, the beginning of our route up the mountain. We start at a steady pace through the lush rainforest giving us the chance to spot some of the colourful birds and wildlife that call this area home. Our campsite tonight is Machame Camp at 3100m.

**DAY 4:** Machame Camp to Shira Caves. After our first night under canvas we wake early for a hearty breakfast before we set off for our second day trekking. We leave the rainforest today and entre moorland plains scattered with rocks and heather. Our camp tonight is by Shira Caves which sits at 3840m.

**DAY 5:** Shira Caves to Barranco Camp. We leave camp behind us this morning and head east for our ascent to the Lava Tower at 4,600m. The scenery dramatically changes as we head into the Barranco Valley where we are met by huge senecio plants before we set sight upon our camp at 3,900m.

**DAY 6:** Barranco Camp to Karanga Valley. Our challenge this morning is the Barranco Wall which we can see from camp. The path to the top is steep but we are rewarded with stunning views across Karanga Valley where we will camp tonight at 4040m.

**DAY 7:** Karanga Valley to Barafu Camp. This morning's walk is a short but steep uphill climb across barren landscapes with lots of boulders and rocks. Tonight we will have the chance to rest and take in Kilimanjaro's neighbouring peak before our final push to the summit tomorrow!

**DAY 8:** Barafu Camp to Uhuru Peak to Millennium Camp. Our trek this morning begins very early and we ascend slowly but surely following the trail of torches in the distance heading towards the summit. This will be a tough day but will certainly provide lots of memorable moments as by sunrise we should be near Stella Point (5750m), which lies on the crater rim. From here we continue our trek to the Uhuru summit (5895m), the roof of Africa! After our celebrations here we descend back down to Millennium Camp (3000m), our final home on the mountain, with a rest stop at Barafu Camp on the way.

**DAY 9:** Millennium Camp to Hotel. Our final trek down the mountain through rainforest leads us the Mweka gate where we collect a certificate of ascent and say goodbye to the mountain. Tonight the celebrations commence with a chance to party with our new trekking buddies and reflect on the incredible challenge we've completed together!

**DAY 10:** Free Day. Today is a free day to relax at the hotel or take a trip into town before we transfer to the airport for our flight back to London

DAY 11: Arrive London.


Guests dressed up in soldier and pilot costumes as well as other traditional 1940s attire, came along to see the centre decked out in decorations reminiscent of the era.




