

LETTER FROM PAULINE

Another year has almost gone by and Holly Hedge is still in the throes of building work. The new kennels are completed, except for the dog flaps being installed, and remedial work carried out to the external kennel runs.

Phase 2 is going well, and the 3 cosy rooms with little gardens are now ready for our long term dogs to move in to, where they can reside in much homelier accommodation until the right homes come along. We hope they don't have to wait too much longer, all they need is time, patience and understanding, and of course, to know that they are loved and wanted.

The new medical room is looking good, and once we have raised the funds for the operating equipment, minor operations will be carried out on site, which will be less stressful for our rescues.

Our dedicated staff have had 2 years of coping with building work mayhem, mud up to (and in) their welly boots, and keeping our rescues as happy as possible during all the upheaval. They all have to be commended for doing a grand job, and remaining resilient throughout!

In the past year we have rehomed dogs and puppies, and cats and kittens. Our vet bills continue to soar, but no animal is ever denied the treatment they need to give them quality of life. We have a duty of care to all our rescues, and this will always be our first priority.

When the sadness of it all can be overwhelming, and we think our best is never good enough, the happy endings mean the world to us – and we can see how much we really do make a difference to so many animals' lives.

In the past year we have homed 143 dogs 357 cats. There is a shortfall on dogs as we only had 12 temporary kennels whilst the new build was taking place. It has been so heart warming to have rehomed lots of our long term rescue dogs such as Riley who was the front page star of our last newsletter, Mya, Ruby Jack, Sam our office dog and our rescued felines including Aragon, Catniss, Poppy & Freddie, Tabby & Smudge and Justine & Mr Tumbles. You can read some of these happy endings and more further on in the newsletter.

Our newsletters give just a glimpse of the work carried out at Holly Hedge, which is supported by so many individuals, too numerous to mention.

It just leaves me to say a huge thank you to all our wonderful staff, volunteers of all descriptions, and the lovely people who adopt our precious rescues – flaws and all, and of course all our supporters who donate their hard earned cash to help keep us afloat. We really couldn't do it without you.

Anyone interested in visiting Holly Hedge to help our rescues, please come and see us during our opening hours – it could change your lives.

As Christmas is just around the corner, Holly Hedge is preparing for our rescues' Christmas dinner, and wrapping up presents kindly donated by generous public. It's their Christmas too, and we pull out all the stops to make it special for them. They may be temporarily homeless, but they are very much loved.

I have promised myself I won't waffle on as pictures speak louder than words, and there are so many happy endings we would like to share with you, as they are so heart-warming and uplifting.

Wishing each and every one of our readers a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. We hope to see you all at our celebration of the new kennels in the Spring which will be announced on our website.



Who'll make me feel my best.




Frankie


Alice

RUN FOR HOLLY HEDGE IN THE 2016 BATH HALF


On 13th March the



And what a wonderful ambassador she was greeting all visitors with her beautiful big brown eyes, her enthusiastic tail wags, (and all over body wags), and of course that irresistible STAFFY SMILE.

Her computer skills were pretty good too! As long as all that technical stuff could be accompanied by lots of cuddles! She was also a dab hand at helping out in the laundry room, and in the kitchen!!

Then one day, Ruby's fortunes really took a turn for the better. Having charmed a gentleman who was looking to rehome a rescue dog, she had finally got that all important reserved sign pinned on her door and was all set for a fresh start in her forever home.

After a couple of months it was time for me to see Ruby for her 'follow up' visit. On arrival, up and seemed very proud to welcome me into her home. She was definitely excited and happy to have a visitor, but there was none of the frantic leaping that often used to take place in her kennel, as she is now a very relaxed girl in a caring, secure home. This time she just sat on my lap, wrapped both her front paws around my shoulders and smothered me with staffy kisses! She wasn't sad about me leaving her, as she now has her devoted owner whose side she barely leaves. Apparently she will even push him out of bed in the morning if she's feeling like an early breakfast! But he never bothers to close his door as Ruby knows just how to open it and does prefer a human bed to sleep on at night time! She is also well known in the neighbourhood and extremely popular.

As I left, (reluctantly) a little face was peering out at me through her garden fence as if to say, 'I'm fine now' and I thought 'In that case, so am I!'

We first met Belle when she was brought to the safety of Holly Hedge as a young puppy with a severely wounded leg. In fact, her leg was so badly injured that no amount of surgery could have saved it and our vet had no choice but to amputate. In spite of all the pain and discomfort she must have been in and the trauma she had been through, Belle never let this get her down and she had nothing but love and kisses for everyone she met! She also managed perfectly well on 3 legs and clearly wasn't going to let her past prevent her from looking optimistically to the future. I was somewhat apprehensive about her, (staffies have THAT reputation, which I can honestly say they don't deserve!) We were asked if we wanted to take Belle for a walk, and my other half jumped at the chance before I had any opportunity to say "No"! What sold me on Belle was the way she was with Bonnie, our little girl (who was 19 months old at the time.) Belle picked up her ball, placed it gently at Bonnie's feet, and sat down waiting to play! We played Ball for a little bit and went on to look at other dogs, but we kept coming back to Belle! Eventually we went back to the office and told them we were interested in a dog, and when we said we wanted Belle, I thought the girls in the office were going to faint! We met Belle on 24th of June, and she came home with us on the 26th! She settled in so easily, falling asleep in the living room within 5 minutes of getting there! She fits in so perfectly with our quirky little family, we just can't imagine life without our Bobo!

I was found in the woods when I was still very young, I was under a year old. I was scared, cold, pregnant and alone. I was taken to a place of safety where I was told by lovely people that I was safe now and that I would be okay. But how could I trust them? I'd never known a safe environment, humans had already let me down and abandoned me. I'd never known love or the who would hurt me.

All I could show was aggression but this was because I was so frightened, I had no idea how to behave around these people who were trying to help me. I would bark constantly and lunge at anyone who came near me.

After I had been at Holly Hedge for a while, I gave birth to the most stunning litter of puppies. Physically they were all like me - 'mini Myas' with their little white bodies, black patches and beautiful dark brown, shiny button eyes.

But unlike their doting mother, they were completely fearless and full of fun, as they had only ever experienced the kindness of people at Holly Hedge, who adored them all as much as I did. Naturally I was very protective of them and everybody told me what an excellent mother I was. One by one, my babies went off to their new homes with their loving families where they could not knowing what the future, if anything, had in store for me.

I really loved the staff at Holly Hedge because I had quickly learnt to trust them and knew they'd look after me for as long as it took before they could find me my 'forever home'. But I still found strangers extremely scary, as I couldn't be sure they wouldn't hurt me. When other people walked past my kennel, all I could do was bark in order to protect myself, and then they'd quickly walk on by to the next dog, leaving me looking worried and confused all over again.

And so this went on for what seemed like an eternity. But the staff at Holly Hedge never gave up on me and were always keen to introduce me to new people so that I could have more friends with whom I felt happy to go out walking in the woods. It only loved it when other people took me out for walks and afterwards, if I was lucky, they'd spend time cuddling me in my kennel and often I'd fall fast asleep on their laps, enjoying the comfort of a tender stroke and being softly spoken to. Playing with tennis back into my kennel — the other dogs must have wondered where they'd all disappeared to!

One day a special, lovely couple came to meet me, but again I didn't know who they were and whether they would hurt me so lunged at them. I felt sad as they seemed so lovely and nice but I had scared them. I was very surprised when the following weekend they came to see me again!

No-one else had ever wanted to see me again after first meeting me so I was really amazed when they came again the next weekend as well and for once I sensed a glimmer of hope for the future. I couldn't believe it as this was something that only ever happened to the other dogs at Holly Hedge! This very special couple returned to see me every week for 5 months allowing me to slowly get to know them and play ball with them! They would bring a handsome boy Staffie called Boris with them to visit me, he was quite nice too! I was allowed to visit Boris's home twice and we got on really well!

One day I went to see Boris's home and I have been here ever since. I found it very strange and difficult being in this new environment as I had spent so long (over a year) fiving in a kennel. I didn't know how to behave or what these humans expected from me. Going for walks was really terrifying for me as I had no idea about the outside world and what was going to happen to me as I am so terrified of new people.

The lovely behaviourist from Holly Hedge has been out to see me since I've been here and she talked to my hoomans about me. Both me and Boris have had another lady visiting us, I think she's helping my hoomans to help teach me how to be a nice young lady.

I'm truly loving my new brother Boris and we play together lots! He is teaching me that it is safe in this new house and that I don't need to worry or be afraid. I'm slowly bonding with my mummy too and learning that she won't hurt me. It will take me time to learn to trust again and be able to go for walks without being scared. I am so grateful to the hoomans at Holly Hedge who took me in and never gave up on me and to my new family who have shown me what love is and that I can be safe and happy.






Animal Sanctuary
